

CASTLE BROMWICH

Theodore Alexander's Castle Bromwich Collection blends timeless furniture designs from the past with a commitment to environmental sustainability for the future. Each Castle Bromwich piece is handcrafted with beautiful reclaimed wood from architectural salvage, giving these often rare species new life while every piece reduces the demand for new wood.

The soul of this collection is inspired by Castle Bromwich Hall, a 16th century Elizabethan Manor house belonging to Theodore Alexander, currently being restored back to its original splendour, another example of breathing life into something old and beautiful.

This impressive collection offers something unique, giving Theodore Alexander's cabinet makers the opportunity of transforming the inherent natural characteristics and patina of these hand selected old timbers into treasured pieces of furniture, to be enjoyed for generations to come.

Castle Bromwich Hall is a remarkable building of great historical importance, the mansion was built in the late 16th century for Sir Edward Deveraux, the first Member of Parliament and High Sheriff of Warwickshire. The hall is of late Elizabethan design with strong Jacobean influences, comprising of four gabled ranges surrounding a small courtyard. The rear facade of the Hall is famous for having twelve windows - one for each Apostle and four dormers above - one for each Evangelist.

The estate was sold in 1657 to Sir John Bridgeman at which time the family made numerous changes to both the gardens, now open to the public and the main house. These included the addition of a magnificent Baroque porch which features the Deveraux coat of arms over the twisted stone columns of the porch and the figures above, named Peace and Plenty.
